I. God = Godhead = Trinity (Lat. trinus, "threefold")

Gen. 1:1 "In the beginning God ['elohiym] created the heaven [pl] and the earth."


- 1. Name: God = 'elohiym masc. pl., gods=3 or more in Hebrew.
- 2. plural pronouns used for God (Gen. 1:26; 3:22; 11:7)

II. Revelation and the Godhead (Rom. 1:20-23)

- 1. The Father (Eph. 3:14-15)
- 2. Jesus Christ:
 - a. We see God in Christ: John 1:18; 12:45; 14:9
 - b. To know the Son is to know the Father: John 8:19; 14:7-9
- 3. Holy Spirit: 1 Cor. 2:10-16; 1 John 4:1-6; John 14:26, 15:26

III. The Holy Spirit

- 1. References: OT=75; NT = 225.
- 2. Personhood of the Spirit of God
 - a. The Spirit is not an impersonal force.
 - b. Not the Native Indian "Great Spirit."
 - c. The Holy Spirit is a person with attributes of a person (e.g. will, mind, etc.)

The Holy Spirit - Personhood Session 2

I. Holy Spirit is a Person

1. His name: Hebrew τη ruwach; Greek πνευμα pneuma "spirit, wind, breath" Neuter noun.

a. Helping words identify Him as masculine (John 15:26; 16:7-8; 16:13-14; Eph. 1:14) ²⁶ "But when the Helper [Gr. parakletos, masc. "comforter"] comes, whom I shall send to you from the Father, the Spirit [Gr. pneuma] of truth who proceeds from the Father, He [Gr. ekeinos, masc.] will testify of Me. (John 15:26)

b. Arius (c. 256-336): HS was only the "exerted energy of God."

2. Personality:

a. Intelligence:

i) He searches all things (1 Cor. 2:10-11)

⁹ But as it is written: "Eye has not seen, nor ear heard, Nor have entered into the heart of man The things which God has prepared for those who love Him." ¹⁰ But God has revealed [Gr. apokalupto, "to uncover, make known"] *them* to us through His Spirit. For the Spirit searches [Gr. ereunao, "to search, examine into"] all things, yes, the deep things of God. ¹¹ For what man knows the things of a man except the spirit of the man which is in him? Even so no one knows the things of God except the Spirit of God. (1Cor 2:9-11)

ii) He has a mind (Rom. 8:27)

Now He who searches [Gr. ereunao, "to search, examine into"] the hearts knows what the mind [Gr. phronema, "what one has in mind, the thoughts"] of the Spirit is, because He makes intercession for the saints according to the will of God. (Rom 8:27 NKJ)

iii) He teaches (1 Cor. 2:13)

¹³ These things we also speak, not in words which man's wisdom teaches but which the Holy Spirit teaches, comparing [Gr. sugkrino, "to join together, compare, interpret"] spiritual things with spiritual. (1Co 2:13 NKJ)

b. Emotions (Eph. 4:30)

⁸ "The wind [Gr. pneuma] blows where it wishes, and you hear the sound of it, but cannot tell where it comes from and where it goes. So is everyone who is born of the Spirit [Gr. pneuma]." (John 3:8)

¹³ "However, when He [Gr. ekeinos, masc.], the Spirit [Gr. pneuma] of truth, has come, He will guide you into all truth; for He will not speak on His own *authority*, but whatever He hears He will speak; and He will tell you things to come. ¹⁴ "He [Gr. ekeinos, masc.] will glorify Me, for He will take of what is Mine and declare *it* to you. (John 16:13-14)

³⁰ And do not grieve [Gr. lupeo, "to make sorrowful, affect with sadness, cause grief"] the Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed [Gr. spragizo, "to set a seal upon, mark with a seal"] for the day of redemption. (Eph 4:30)

c. Will (1 Cor. 12:11)

¹¹ But one and the same Spirit works all these things, distributing to each one individually as He wills [Gr. boulomai, "to will deliberately, have a purpose"]. (1Cor 12:11)

3. The Holy Spirit performs personal actions

a. He teaches and guides (John 14:26; 16:13; 1 Cor. 2:13)

- ²⁶ "But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things, and bring to your remembrance all things that I said to you. (John 14:26)
- ¹³ "However, when He, the Spirit of truth, has come, He will guide [Gr. hodegeo, "to be a guide, lead, teach"] you into all truth; for He will not speak on His own *authority*, but whatever He hears He will speak; and He will tell you things to come. (John 16:13)
- ¹³ These things we also speak, not in words which man's wisdom teaches but which the Holy Spirit teaches, comparing spiritual things with spiritual. (1Co 2:13 NKJ)

b. He speaks (Acts 13:2; 21:11; Gal. 4:6; 1 Tim. 4:1-3)

² As they ministered to the Lord and fasted, the Holy Spirit said [Gr. lego, "to speak, say"], "Now separate to Me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them." (Act 13:2)

Now the Spirit expressly [Gr. rhetos, "in express words"] says [Gr. lego, "to say, speak"] that in latter times some will depart from the faith, giving heed to deceiving spirits and doctrines of demons, ² speaking lies in hypocrisy, having their own conscience seared with a hot iron, ³ forbidding to marry, and commanding to abstain from foods which God created to be received with thanksgiving by those who believe and know the truth. (1Tim 4:1-3)

c. He convicts (Gen. 6:3; <u>John 16:8</u>)

⁸ "And when He has come, He will convict [Gr. elegcho, "to convict, refute, rebuke, correct"] the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment: (John 16:8)

d. He testifies (John 15:26; Rom. 8:16)

²⁶ "But when the Helper comes, whom I shall send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth who proceeds from the Father, He will testify [Gr. martureo, "to bear witness, testify"] of Me. (John 15:26)

e. He leads (Acts 16:6; Rom. 8:14; Gal. 5:18)

¹⁴ For as many as are led [Gr. ago, "to lead, go, direct"] by the Spirit of God, these are sons of God. (Rom 8:14)

f. He intercedes (Rom. 8:26)

- g. He regenerates (gives life) (John 3:6; Titus 3:5)
- h. He fellowships (2 Cor. 13:14)
- 4. Holy Spirit treated as a person
 - a. He may be grieved and resisted (Gen. 6:3; Isa. 63:10; Eph. 4:30)
- ³⁰ And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed for the day of redemption. (Eph 4:30 NKJ)

Session 3

I. Holy Spirit is God – the deity of the Holy Spirit
His name: Hebrew ፲٠١ ruwach; Greek πνευμα pneuma "spirit, wind, breath" Neuter noun.

³ But Peter said, "Ananias, why has Satan filled your heart to **lie to the Holy Spirit** and keep back *part* of the price of the land for yourself? ⁴ "While it remained, was it not your own? And after it was sold, was it not in your own control? Why have you conceived this thing in your heart? **You have not lied to men but to God.**" ⁵ Then Ananias, hearing these words, fell down and breathed his last. So great fear came upon all those who heard these things. (Acts 5:3-4)

⁹ But you are not in the flesh but in the Spirit, if indeed the **Spirit of God** dwells in you. were ministering the things which now have been reported to you through those who have preached the gospel to you by **the Holy Spirit** sent from heaven-- things which angels desire to look into. (1Pet 1:10-12 NKJ)

¹² Beloved, do not think it strange concerning the fiery trial which is to try you, as though some strange thing happened to you; ¹³ but rejoice to the extent that you partake of Christ's sufferings, that when His glory is revealed, you may also be glad with exceeding joy. ¹⁴ If you are reproached (Gr. oneidizo, "revile, upbraided") for the name of Christ, blessed *are you*, for **the Spirit of glory and of God** ($\underline{\tau o}$ $\tau \eta \varsigma \delta o \xi \eta \varsigma \kappa \alpha \iota \underline{\tau o} \tau o \tilde{\upsilon} \theta \epsilon o \tilde{\upsilon} \pi \nu \epsilon \tilde{\upsilon} \mu \alpha$) rests upon you. On their part He is blasphemed, but on your part He is glorified. (1Pe 4:12-14 NKJ)

⁷ But we speak the wisdom of God in a mystery, the hidden *wisdom* which God ordained before the ages for our glory, ⁸ which none of the rulers of this age knew; for had they known, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory. ⁹ But as it is written: "Eye has not seen, nor ear heard, Nor have entered into the heart of man The things which God has prepared for those who love Him." ¹⁰ But God has revealed *them* to us through His Spirit. For the Spirit searches all things, yes, the deep things [Gr. bathos, "deep"] of God. ¹¹ For what man knows the things of a man except the spirit of the man which is in him? Even so no one knows the things of God except the Spirit of God. ¹² Now we have received, not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God, that we might know the things that have been freely given to us by God. ¹³ These things we also speak, not in words which man's wisdom teaches but which the Holy Spirit teaches, comparing spiritual things with spiritual. (1Co 2:7-13 NKJ)

⁴ The Spirit of God has made me, And the breath of the Almighty (Heb. shadday, "almighty, all powerful") gives me life. (Job 33:4 NKJ)

⁷ Where can I go from Your Spirit? Or where can I flee from Your presence? ⁸ If I ascend into heaven, You *are* there; If I make my bed in hell, behold, You *are* there. ⁹ If I take the wings of the morning, *And* dwell in the uttermost parts of the sea, ¹⁰ Even there Your hand shall lead me, And Your right hand shall hold me. (Psa 139:7-10 NKJ)

¹⁶ "And I will pray the Father, and He will give you another (Gr. allos, "another of the same kind") Helper, that He may abide with you forever-- ¹⁷ "the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees Him nor knows Him; but you know Him, for He dwells with you and will be in you. (John 14:16-17 NKJ)

⁹ These shall be punished with everlasting destruction from the presence (Gr. prosopon, "before the face, sight") of the Lord and from the glory of His power (2Th 1:9 NKJ)

¹⁰ "he himself shall also drink of the wine of the wrath of God, which is poured out full strength into the cup of His indignation. He shall be tormented with fire and brimstone in the presence of the holy angels and in the presence (Gr. enopion, "in presence") of the Lamb. (Rev 14:10 NKJ)

- ¹¹ In Him also we have obtained an inheritance, being predestined according to the purpose of Him who works all things according to the counsel of His will, ¹² that we who first trusted in Christ should be to the praise of His glory. ¹³ In Him you also *trusted*, after you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation; in whom also, having believed, you were sealed with the Holy Spirit of promise, ¹⁴ who is the guarantee [Gr. arrabon, "an earnest"] of our inheritance until the redemption of the purchased possession, to the praise of His glory. (Eph 1:11-14)

4. Seal (2 Cor. 1:22; Eph. 1:13; 4:30)

²⁹ Let no corrupt word proceed out of your mouth, but what is good for necessary edification, that it may impart grace to the hearers. ³⁰ And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed [Gr. sphragizo, Aor. Pas., "to set a seal upon, to mark with a seal"] for the day of redemption. ³¹ Let all bitterness, wrath, anger, clamor, and evil speaking be put away from you, with all malice. ³² And be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, just as God in Christ forgave you. (Eph 4:29-32 NKJ)

5. Fire (Acts 2:3)

When the Day of Pentecost had fully come, they were all with one accord in one place. ² And suddenly there came a sound from heaven, as of a rushing mighty wind [Gr. pnoe, breath, wind"], and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. ³ Then there appeared to them divided [Gr. diamerizo, "part, divide, cut in pieces"] tongues [Gr. glossa, "the tongue, a language, dialect"], as [Gr. hosei, "as it were"] of fire [Gr. pur, "fire"], and *one* sat upon each of them. ⁴ And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance. (Acts 2:1-4)

ii) Creation by the Word (Ps. 33:6; Ps. 104:30)

² The earth was without form, and void; and darkness *was* on the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God was hovering [Heb. rachaph, "to move, grow soft, flutter, hover" Piel=intense, repeated action] over the face of the waters.

³ Then God said, "Let there be light"; and there was light.

⁴ And God saw the light, that *it was* good; and God divided the light from the darkness.

⁵ God called the light Day, and the darkness He called Night. So the evening and the morning were the first day.

⁶ Then God said, "Let there be a firmament in the midst of the waters, and let it divide the waters from the waters." ⁷ Thus God made the firmament, and divided the waters which *were* under the firmament from the waters which *were* above the firmament; and it was so. ⁸ And God called the firmament Heaven. So the evening and the morning were the second day. ⁹ Then God said, "Let the waters under the heavens be gathered together into one place, and let the dry *land* appear"; and it was so.

The Holy Spirit in the Old Testament II

Session 8

I. Holy Spirit in Divine Revelation

1. God purposed to make man for communion/communication (Gen. 1:26)

²⁶ Then God said, "Let Us make [Heb. 'asah, "to fashion, make"] man in Our image [Heb. tselem, "image"], according to Our likeness [Heb. demuth, "likeness"]; let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth." ²⁷ So God created [Heb. bara', "to create"] man in His *own* image; in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them. (Gen 1:26-27 NKJ)

2. God spoke to man (Gen. 1:28)

²⁸ Then God blessed them, and God said [Heb. 

Regeneration. Defn., (1) The work of God that generates a new life to the one that believes (Titus 3:5). (2) The work of God that generates a new dispensation in creation during the kingdom age (Matt 19:28).

²⁸ So Jesus said to them, "Assuredly I say to you, that in the regeneration (Gr. paliggenesia, "new birth, reproduction, renewal, recreation, renovation, regeneration), when the Son of Man sits on the throne of His glory, you who have followed Me will also sit on twelve thrones, judging the twelve tribes of Israel. (Matt. 19:28 NKJ)

³ For we ourselves were also once foolish, disobedient, deceived, serving various lusts and pleasures, living in malice and envy, hateful and hating one another. ⁴ But when the kindness and the love of God our Savior toward man appeared, ⁵ not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to His mercy He saved us, through the washing of regeneration (Gr. paliggenesia) and renewing of the Holy Spirit,

⁶ whom He poured out on us abundantly through Jesus Christ our Savior, ⁷ that having been justified by His grace we should become heirs according to the hope of eternal life. (Tit 3:3-7 NKJ)

- ¹¹ But one and the same Spirit works all these things, distributing to each one individually as He wills.
- ¹² For as the body is one and has many members, but all the members of that one body, being many, are one body, so also *is* Christ.

2. Yielding to God (Rom. 6:13-14)

¹⁴ But their minds were blinded (Gr. poroo, "to cover with a thick skin, to harden by covering with a callous"),. For until this day the same veil remains unlifted in the reading of the Old Testament, because the *veil* is taken away in Christ.

¹⁵ But even to this day, when Moses is read, a veil lies on their heart.

¹⁶ Nevertheless when one turns to the Lord, the veil is taken away.

¹⁷ Now the Lord is the Spirit; and where the Spirit of the Lord *is*, there *is* liberty (Gr.eleutheria, "liberty to do as one pleases").

¹⁸ But we all, with unveiled face, beholding as in a mirror the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from glory to glory, just as by the Spirit of the Lord. (2 Cor. 3:14-18)

²⁰ But you have not so learned (Gr. manthano, "to learn, to increase in knowledge, understand") Christ,

²¹ if indeed you have heard Him and have been taught by Him, as the truth is in Jesus:

²² that you put off, concerning your former conduct, the old man which grows corrupt according to the deceitful lusts,

²³ and be renewed in the spirit of your mind,

²⁴ and that you put on the new man which was created according to God, in true righteousness and holiness.

²⁵ Therefore, putting away lying, "*Let* each one *of you* speak truth with his neighbor," for we are members of one another.

²⁶ "Be angry, and do not sin": do not let the sun go down on your wrath,

²⁷ nor give place to the devil. (Eph 4:20-27 NKJ)

¹⁰ For *the death* that He died, He died to sin once for all; but *the life* that He lives, He lives to God.

- 11 Likewise you also, reckon yourselves to be dead indeed to sin, but alive to God in Christ Jesus our Lord.
- ¹² Therefore do not let sin reign in your mortal body, that you should obey it in its lusts.
- ¹³ And do not present (Gr. paristemi, "to set at hand, present, yield, stand") your members *as* instruments of unrighteousness to sin, but present yourselves to God as being alive from the dead, and your members *as* instruments of righteousness to God.
- ¹⁴ For sin shall not have dominion over you, for you are not under law but under grace. (Rom 6:10-14 NKJ)

3. Led by the Spirit = Assurance (Rom. 8:16)

4. Three types of spiritual people

i) Natural (Jude 19)

¹⁹ These are sensual (Gr. psuchikos, "natural, sensual, breathing") persons, who cause divisions, not having the Spirit. (Jud 1:19 NKJ)

ii) Spiritual (1 Cor. 2:15)

- ⁹ But as it is written: "Eye has not seen, nor ear heard, Nor have entered into the heart of man The things which God has prepared for those who love Him."
- ¹⁰ But God has revealed *them* to us through His Spirit. For the Spirit searches all things, yes, the deep things of God.
- ¹¹ For what man knows the things of a man except the spirit of the man which is in him? Even so no one knows the things of God except the Spirit of God.
- ¹² Now we have received, not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God, that we might know the things that have been freely given to us by God.
- ¹³ These things we also speak, not in words which man's wisdom teaches but which the Holy Spirit teaches, comparing spiritual things with spiritual.
- ¹⁴ But the natural (Gr. psuchikos, "natural, sensual, breathing") man does not receive the things of the Spirit of God, for they are foolishness to him; nor can he know *them*, because they are spiritually discerned.
- ¹⁵ But he who is spiritual (Gr. pneumatikos, "spiritual") judges all things, yet he himself is *rightly* judged by no one.
- ¹⁶ For "who has known the mind of the LORD that he may instruct Him?" But we have the mind of Christ. (1 Cor. 2:9-16 NKJ)

iii) Carnal (1 Cor. 3:1-4) – a babe in Christ

And I, brethren, could not speak to you as to spiritual *people* but as to carnal (Gr. sarkikos, "fleshly, carnal"), as to babes in Christ.

- ² I fed you with milk and not with solid food; for until now you were not able *to receive it*, and even now you are still not able;
- ³ for you are still carnal. For where *there are* envy, strife, and divisions among you, are you not carnal and behaving like *mere* men?
- ⁴ For when one says, "I am of Paul," and another, "I am of Apollos," are you not carnal? (1 Cor 3:1-4 NKJ)

Note: comforter: parakletos, "called to one's side, one who pleads another's cause before a judge, in the widest sense, a helper, aider, assistant. Of the Holy Spirit destined to take the place of Christ with the apostles (after his ascension to the Father), to lead them to a deeper knowledge of the gospel truth, and give them divine strength needed to enable them to undergo trials and persecutions on behalf of the divine kingdom.

Defn: Spiritual gifts are extraordinary abilities that the Spirit gives to a believer to build up the Church.

1 Cor. 12:31:

- ³¹ But earnestly desire the best gifts. And yet I show you a more excellent way.
- ^{NKJ} **1 Corinthians 13:1** Though I speak with the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I have become sounding brass or a clanging cymbal.
- ² And though I have *the gift of* prophecy, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and though I have all faith, so that I could remove mountains, but have not love, I am nothing.
- ³ And though I bestow all my goods to feed *the poor*, and though I give my body to be burned, but have not love, it profits me nothing.
- ⁴ Love suffers long *and* is kind; love does not envy; love does not parade itself, is not puffed up;
- ⁵ does not behave rudely, does not seek its own, is not provoked, thinks no evil;
- ⁶ does not rejoice in iniquity, but rejoices in the truth;
- ⁷ bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.
- ⁸ Love never fails (Gr ekpipto, "to fall out of"). But whether *there are* prophecies, they will fail (Gr. katargeo, "to render idle, cause to cease"); whether *there are* tongues, they will cease (Gr. pauo, "to make to cease"); whether *there is* knowledge, it will vanish away (Gr. katargeo, "to render idle, do away").
- ⁹ For we know in part and we prophesy in part.
- ¹⁰ But when that which is perfect has come, then that which is in part will be done away (Gr. katargeo, "render idle").
- ¹¹ When I was a child, I spoke as a child, I understood as a child, I thought as a child; but when I became a man, I put away childish things.
- ¹² For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then face to face. Now I know in part, but then I shall know just as I also am known.
- ¹³ And now abide faith, hope, love, these three; but the greatest of these *is* love. (1Co 12:31-13:13 NKJ)
